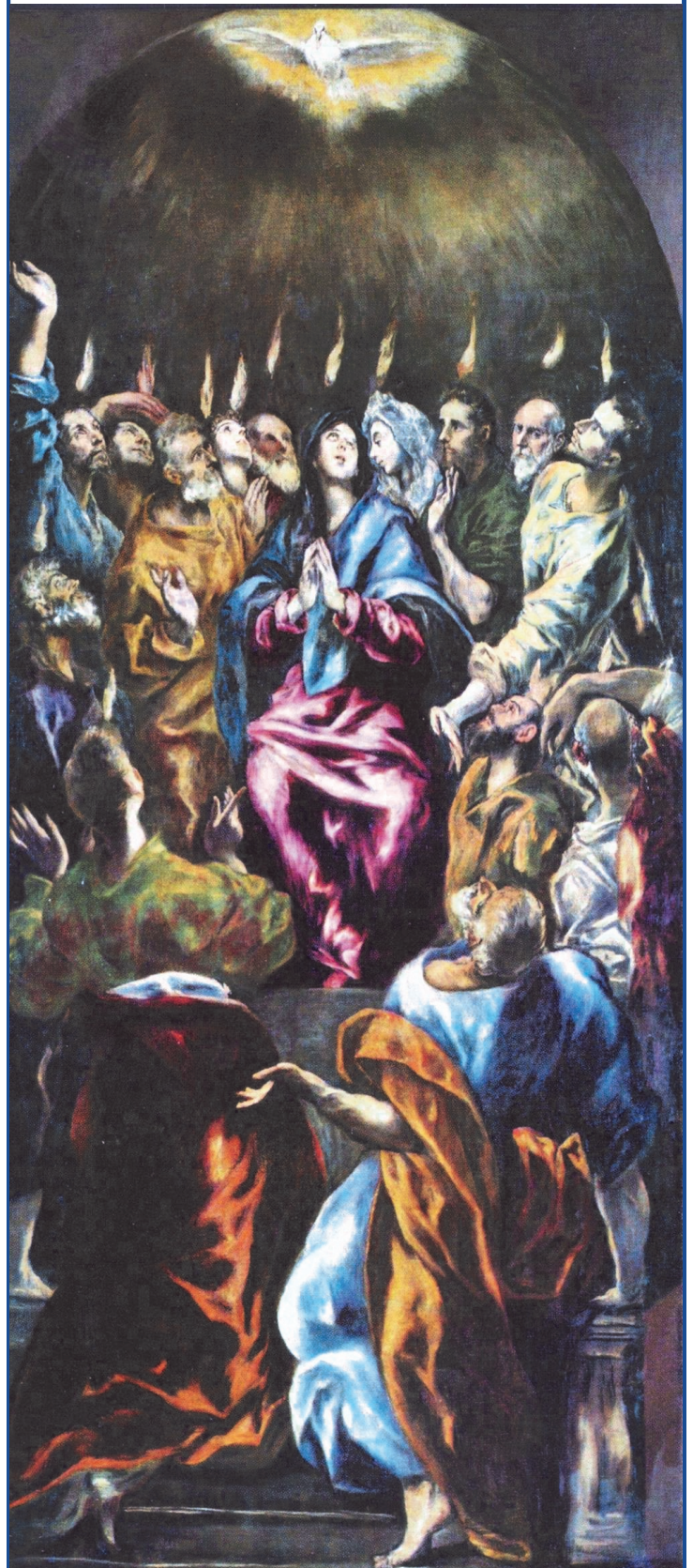

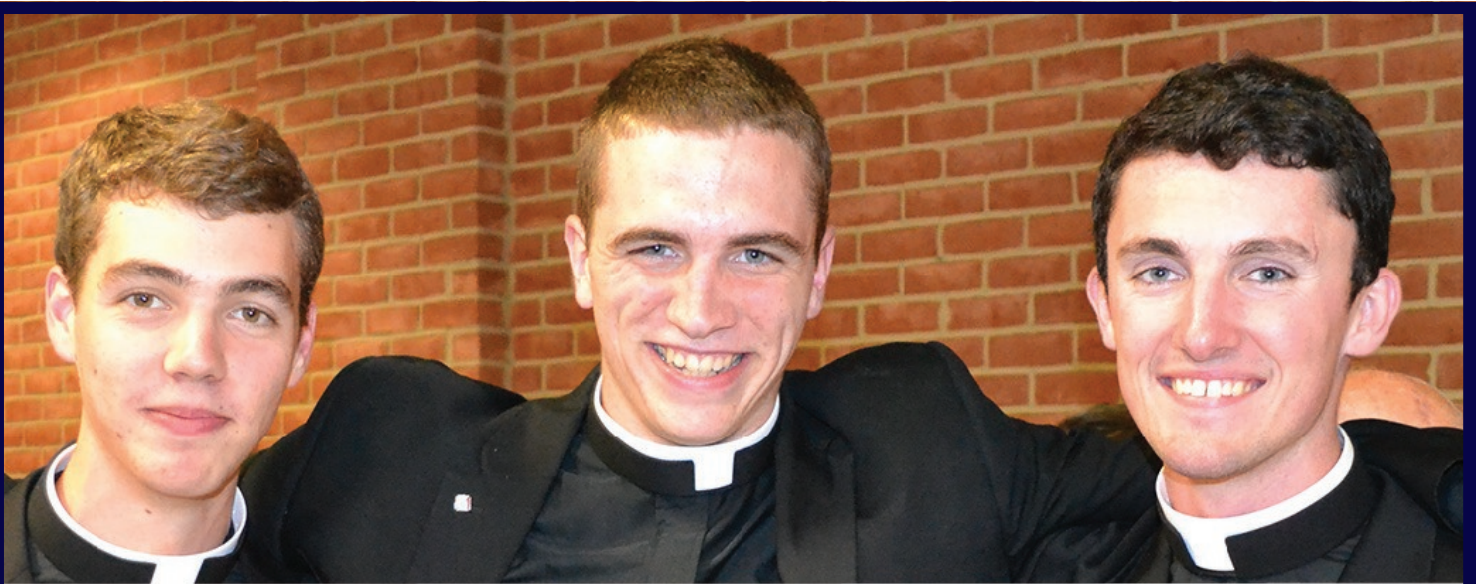
### THE CONFRATERNITY OF THE HOLY ROSARY MONTHLY GATHERING JUNE 24
