#### LANDSCAPE RENOVATION

You may have noticed we have begun work on upgrading the area known as Fr. McAfee's Rose Garden. Our plan is to install sod for most of the area and a large flower bed in front of the low brick wall with several annual plants including daffodils, tulips, irises and other seasonal colored plantings. The current irrigation system requires an up grade and that cost is estimated at \$2,200. The sod planting and grading is estimated to cost approximately \$3,100. There are other costs as well; including a perimeter boarder, river bed rocks and accent lighting on the statue of Mary. 


