FROM THE DESK OF THE SEMINARIAN ...

In the fifteenth chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus gives us the image of the vine and the branches. As He puts it, "I am the vine, you are the branches" (Jn 15:5). It is very clear by this that we are to remain connected to Christ in order that we may bear fruit. After all, "the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine."

On one hand, this seems to be a rather simple image intended to portray how it is that we need to be connected to Christ. Many Christians over the centuries have taken this to mean that in order to follow Christ they should take lead from His example and obey His word. But while both of these approaches are virtuous and beneficial, by using the image of the vine and the branches, Christ is calling His followers to something far deeper.

Christ invites us to "abide" in Him. Other translations use the word "remain." The word is important, for it emphasizes something beyond a simple connection to Christ. It is not enough to know about Christ, or even to follow His example. Rather, in order to truly be a branch on the Divine vine, we must enter into Christ Himself.

This points towards the necessity of the Eucharist. After all, if it is not enough just to follow Christ's example and to know and obey His teachings, then one might wonder what else there is that we can do? The answer is simple: there is nothing *we* can do. Rather, Christ did everything through His paschal sacrifice. He offered Himself as expiation to the Father for the sins of the world.

Knowing the teachings of the faith is not enough. One can know all that the Church has to say on any particular topic and miss out on the promise of salvation. In the end, the Christian faith is not marked primarily by knowledge. Rather, to truly be Christian is to enter into Christ Himself, something only made possible by His sacrifice on the cross and the gift of the Eucharist. It is for this reason that Jesus tells His followers "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you" (Jn 6:53).

By receiving the Eucharist, the Christian enters into the very life of the Trinity itself. It is only through this type of communion with the Godhead that the Christian can truly be united as a branch to the vine of Christ. Connected to the Divine vine and watered by the grace of the Sacraments, the Christian can truly bear great fruit.
