

FROM THE DESK OF THE SEMINARIAN ...

Dear Parishioners of St. John the Beloved,

It really was a blessing for me to be able to share the Feast of Corpus Christi with you all here at the parish. The Liturgy was beautiful, and the procession was inspirational. It was truly incredible to see so many people come together to celebrate the Holy Eucharist.

As a part of the Eucharistic procession, what struck me most was not all the people in line behind me, but rather those that I saw straight ahead. When we exited the Church, we turned to go down the hill towards the lower parking lot. This meant that we were visible to the cars there stopped at the light on the street. As I was walking, I couldn't help but notice the reactions of the different people in their cars as they saw this gathering coming towards them. For most, they probably just saw a crowd of people walking down the hill in some sort of ceremony. One can bet, however, that at least one of those people saw the monstrance and was moved in some way.

Seeing the people sitting in their cars made me stop and evaluate: what would I do if I was to see Jesus walking directly towards me? Would I even realize it was Him? I would like to think that such is the case, but as the Gospels have shown us, most people were unable to recognize Him as the Son of God even while He was walking and performing miracles here on earth. Would I be just like those people in their cars who completely missed the fact that the God of all creation was mere feet away?

I began to muse as to what I would do if I did in fact know that it was Christ walking towards me. Immediately coming to mind was the possibility that I would be paralyzed by shame, crippled by my awareness of my own sinfulness, and think that it was impossible for me to approach Him or that He could have mercy on a sinner such as myself. Reflecting on this made me wonder how many people who were stopped at the light had that same experience. Perhaps they might have been fallen away Catholics who saw the monstrance and felt some sort of longing, but thought themselves too far astray to join the procession and walk alongside the Lord. Pondering this a little longer soon led to a feeling of great joy. After all, Christ is the fount of all mercy. As St. Peter experienced even after directly denying our Lord, Jesus is always more than ready to welcome His sheep back into the fold. The Good Shepherd does not wait for us to wander back to Him. Rather, when we go astray He pursues us, reaching out His hand to eagerly reclaim us for Himself despite the messes that we create. It hit me that being stopped at the light was just another way in which Christ was inviting the people in those cars back to Himself.

I then turned my mind to the other response that I might have if Christ were to walk up to me. It was this response which St. Peter chose when, after the Resurrection, he saw Jesus standing on the beach. Peter wasted no time; he jumped out of his boat and swam to Christ. My hopeful thought is that I would do the same, eagerly approaching Christ in order to thank and worship Him. After all, this is the response to Christ that we are all called to have as true disciples.

After the procession was over, and the light had changed and the cars driven off, it hit me that in a sense this was not as unique an experience as I had thought. Sure, it's not every day that the Eucharist is paraded towards you while you wait at a traffic light. But it is every day that the Lord walks into our lives and we are faced with the decision. Will we recognize Him or turn away in shame? Or, rather, will we be able to respond as Peter did and make haste towards Him, aware not only of our sinfulness but even more so of God's infinite mercy.


