For us it should be enough to say that "Jackets are optional for gentlemen and women should dress comparably."



Whether it be for

weddings or proms we know that even young people like to dress sharp... at least some of the time.

Holy Mass is a visit to heaven, which Our Lord compared to a wedding banquet. To illustrate how our souls should be prepared for Divine and angelic company, He even referred to and reaffirmed his listeners' expectations with regard to dress (Matthew 22,1-14). To be sure, glamour is not the question but respect and dignity. St. Peter spoke of how virtue is more important than jewelry (1Peter 3,3-4). St. Paul echoes the same in his first letter to St. Timothy (1Timothy 2,9).

Please keep dressing well and spare me from going into more detail.

FROM THE DESK OF THE SEMINARIAN ...

The last couple of weeks have been very busy back at my home, as my family is in the process of moving. As one can imagine, it has been very stressful, full of long days of hauling boxes from house to house. Perhaps the hardest part is not the move itself, but dealing with all the clutter that has accumulated over the years. It's amazing to go through a room and find all the different things that we never use or don't know where they came from.

In short, clutter is a real problem. If we have too much stuff, then it gets in the way of our move, wasting both time and boxes. Similarly, we can often find our interior lives cluttered as well. All the things which we fill ourselves with often get in the way of our "move" back to God. They block our growth in holiness in a number of ways – for example by wasting time that should be spent in prayer. Therefore, just as when moving houses it helps to de-clutter, so too we need to de-clutter our hearts and minds for our journey towards eternal life.

Perhaps the hardest part of getting rid of clutter is identifying it. When one sees a box of odds-and-ends, everything in it appears to suddenly be essential. As this shows, we have a fear of letting go. But in trying to hold on to the things we need, we often cling to clutter which only serves to weigh us down. The same can be said for our spiritual lives. All too often we believe that something or someone is necessary to make our lives better, and yet miss the fact that we will only ever be truly fulfilled in God. To avoid making this mistake we need to look at the clutter in our lives and ask this simple question: does it bring me to Christ? If it does, then we should pack it up and take it with us as we move towards Heaven. On the other hand, if it does not, then it is simply dead weight. We need to discard it, and quickly, for any time we spend mulling whether to bring it along for the ride simply slows down our move to Christ and leads us one step closer to half-heartedly packing it in the box to keep carrying with us.

One final piece of advice for packing for your big spiritual move: have a friend help. Sometimes no matter how hard we try, we cannot envision letting go of our clutter. But while we may be blinded with nostalgia, dependence, or simply fear of loss, a friend may be able to point out clutter for what it is and demonstrate how it is weighing us down. Then, once we have discarded the clutter, we will have a multitude of empty boxes that God can fill with the things we truly need for the journey home.
