Archbishop Paul Coakley of the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City two weeks ago addressed a letter to all the priests and faithful of his Archdiocese, bringing to their attention



"that a Satanic group has schedule a so-called Black Mass for Sunday, September 21 at the Civic Center Music Hall in Oklahoma City.

Among my favorite books is *Diary of a Country Priest* by Georges Bernanos. One of the characters makes the point that the priest is formed in large part by the totality of the persons he encounters during his time of preparation. I could not agree more, and my time at St. John's has once again shown how true this idea is. In this, my last summer assignment, I was so fortunate to encounter so many formational people whose lessons I will carry with me into priestly ministry.

The people of this parish have, since I arrived been tremendous examples of Christian charity and faithfulness. I was welcomed warmly and have not failed to be impressed with the level of knowledge and devotion that I found. I certainly hope to emmulate these traits in my life as I draw closer to the altar.

I must thank the staff here at St. John's especially Ann Thunder who was a wonderful example of joyful service in the midst of many responsibilities--not to mention running an all-star altar serving corps. I would also like to thank Joan and Kathryn in the office who helped me to navigate the administrative side of parish life and with whom I shared many hearty laughs.

Father Pollard was a wonderful mentor and example of shepherdly care, He allowed me to grow into various roles in the parish but was always ready to help whenever I had a question.
