FROM THE DESK OF THE SEMINARIAN ...

Recently I was asked by a fellow seminarian if I knew what the name “Daniel” meant. When I told him that I did not know, he was able to tell me that it means “God is my judge.” In light of this recent conversation, the phrase “God is my judge” has been on my mind. Reflecting on it the other day, I have come to believe that within this simple phrase is a perspective on life that is imperative for us to possess as Christians.

The world tells us that it is bad to judge, whether the object of said judgment be a person or some action. It asserts that each individual is utterly free to think, say, and do whatever he wants. But simply stopping human beings from judging is not enough. Instead, the world wants to erase the idea that there ever can be any sort of judgment at all. Modernity rejects all moral ramification. This means that the world has rejected the notion that we will ever be judged for any of our thoughts, words, and actions here on this earth. As Christians, however, we believe that our lives are not our own. Rather, we are gifted them by God, and are called to respond by living lives in accordance with His will. We believe that we will be judged at the end of our days in accordance with how we have lived His will. Therefore, we reject the world’s position that there is no such thing as judgement, choosing instead to live with the awareness that at the end of the days we will be judged.

The awareness that we will one day be judged should not cripple us with fear. Rather, it should help us approach our final judgment like the ideal student approaches a major exam. Unlike the student who approaches the test simply afraid of failing, the good student yearns for the chance to demonstrate how he has studied and properly prepared for it. Similarly, while we should have a healthy fear of judgment, noting the reality that it is possible to fail the test, we should also have a healthy sense of hopefulness that by responding to God’s grace and following His will we may be ready to pass the test and one day enter into the kingdom.

One final note: by declaring that “God is my judge” we actually remove a huge burden of undue pressure off of ourselves. This is because we reject all of the other “judges” that we appoint for ourselves. By acknowledging God as our lone judge, we attest that we do not need to live up to the “demands” of our peers, culture, and social status. Rather, with God as our only judge, we are free to live according to His will without the demands of anyone or anything else holding us back.
