HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTIONS

JULY 2017

Lapsed Christians: That our brothers and sisters who have strayed from the faith, through our prayer and witness to the Gospel, may rediscover the merciful closeness of the Lord and the beauty of the Christian life.

In Testimonium...

Catholic theology and Church law make a very important distinction between *material* heresy and *formal* heresy. The 1983 *Code of Canon Law* offers the following description of *formal* heresy:

Can. 751 Heresy is the obstinate denial or obstinate doubt after the reception of baptism of some truth which is to be believed by divine and Catholic faith; apostasy is the total repudiation of the Christian faith; schism is the refusal of submission to the Supreme Pontiff or of communion with the members of the Church subject to him.

The consequences for these sins against the unity of the Church are detailed elsewhere in the *Code*. Material heresy is not penalized in the same way. The *Catholic Encyclopedia* helps us understand:

Towards material heretics [the Church's] conduct is ruled by the saying of St. Augustine: "Those are by no means to be accounted heretics who do not defend their false and perverse opinions with pertinacious zeal (animositas), especially when their error is not the fruit of audacious presumption but has been communicated to them by seduced and lapsed parents, and when they are seeking the truth with cautious solicitude and ready to be corrected" (P.L., XXXIII, ep. xliii, 160). Pius IX, in a letter to the bishops of Italy (10 Aug., 1863), restates this Catholic doctrine: "It is known to Us and to You that they who are in invincible ignorance concerning our religion but observe the natural law . . . and are ready to obey God and lead an honest and righteous life, can, with the help of Divine light and grace, attain to eternal life . . . for God . . . will not allow any one to be eternally punished who is not wilfully guilty" (Denzinger, "Enchir.", n. 1529). X.

A great many Catholics hold heretical opinions about marriage and the sixth commandment. With the anniversary of *Humanae Vitae* falling on July 25, the Feasts of St. James the Greater and St. Christopher, we would do well to reread the document and reappropriate the wisdom of the Church.

The topic of contraception never came up in my life in high school religion class. As a young Catholic having graduated from a secular college, I was willing to accept all the teachings of the Church, even the ones that I did not understand. It was not until listening to Janet Smith (www.janetesmith.org/) that I came to understand and rejoice in the teaching of the Church on this. You can read her talk "Contraception: Why Not?" online for free. FORMED/org also has some good resources, especially one by Jason Evert. Even if you accept the teachings of the Church, please spend some time reacquainting yourself with the topic so you can better explain it to others.

FROM THE DESK OF THE SEMINARIAN ...

In the sixteenth chapter of the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus asks Peter "who do you say that I am?" (Mt 16:15). When Peter responds that Jesus is "the Messiah, the Son of the Living God" (Mt 16:16), He rewards Peter by declaring that he is to be the rock upon which the Church will be built. Speaking about the Church, Christ proclaims that "the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it" (Mt 16:18).

Traditionally, this passage has been interpreted to show that no matter how hard the forces of evil press the Church, she will stand strong. This does not mean that the Church will never stumble. After all, although she is holy, she is also composed of a people scarred by original sin. It is for this reason that St. Paul declared that "we hold this treasure in earthen vessels" (2 Cor 4:7). Yet while the Church is composed of sinners, it seeks to transform them into great saints. Because of her saints and the holiness of her Founder, her Sacraments, and her teachings, we declare in the creed that the Church herself is holy. In asserting that the gates of Hell will never prevail against the Church, it can rightfully be understood that the Church will never lose her holiness despite the attacks that Satan will throw at her.

While the above traditional understanding of this passage certainly rings true, there is another meaning to this passage which carries at least as much importance for the Church and her future. As has been established, Jesus declared that "the *gates* of the netherworld will not prevail against" the Church (emphasis added). According to the traditional definition, Christ's proclamation deals with the Church withstanding Hell's assault. Yet in His proclamation, Jesus mentions the gates of Hell. Gates are defensive measures, intended to stop an attack. Jesus' declaration, therefore, is an assertion that it is the Church which is on offense, seeking to destroy the forces of evil and sin's grasp on the world. Christ is proclaiming the impending victory of the Church's all-out assault on the forces of darkness.

The traditional understanding of Matthew 16:18 certainly holds true. After all, we acknowledge in the prayer to St. Michael that Satan and his evil spirits "prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls." But while Matthew 16:18 reassures us that the Church will stand strong in the face of Satan's attack, the same cannot be said for the forces of darkness. Therefore, we should not only have confidence in the fact that the Church will survive Satan's advances, but rather we should also find our hope in the reality that it is Christ's Church which will storm the gates of Hell and destroy the powers of darkness once and for all.


