FROM THE DESK OF THE SEMINARIAN ...

How did the New Year's resolution(s) you made at the beginning of the year turn out?

Right before Jesus enters Jerusalem for His passion, death, and resurrection He takes a look at the city and cries because they rejected His teachings – teachings that bring true peace. Obviously some teachings are very hard, but that is because it involves a lifestyle change. We get comfortable in our ways and so it can be troubling to change. Ultimately, this requires that we develop new habits, which are hard to do at first and take time. The hardest part is starting them. Little bit by little bit; however, and they become easier.

Often times better habits are not formed because we try to do them all on our own. We need to instead continually pray for God's help throughout the day and admit to Him that we cannot make even one good change on our own. Also, we need to invoke the Holy Spirit to guide us. The help is there, but we have to ask.

Continuing, if we do not trust Jesus and try what He is telling us to do in the Gospels, we are never going to be really happy and will never find true peace. It is like when you correct your son or daughter (or brother, sister, or friend) on something, or when your boss corrects you when you are doing part of your job wrong. Sometimes when we are corrected we may want to say, "Good for you. Leave me alone. MY way is the right way." If we act this way, however, we will never grow and improve. Confession is a great place for us to start refining ourselves. We can look back to where we were and see if we have gotten better. Surely we can make one positive change every year, but it has to start some time. Today, we need to be open to what others tell us; but most especially, to what the Holy Spirit is prompting us to do, which is God's Will for us. We need to be open to the messages of the Gospel. Once again, it is one small change at a time. We will not all of a sudden live it all overnight. For, the Gospel is really deep and rich. The more we live it, the more we will get from it; and so we will be able to see and understand things we were not able to before.

Alright, so the question becomes, "Are you God?" Of course not. Then we need to change to become more like Him. It may be painful at times, but that is what will bring us true and lasting peace. We are like beautiful stone sculptures that God, the Master Sculptor, is chipping away at to make us the magnificent masterpieces that He had in mind when He created us. Each change comes about with His chisel of love. So let us not be at our judgment at the end of our lives and have Jesus look at us and say what He said to Jerusalem before His passion, "If only you knew what would bring you peace."


