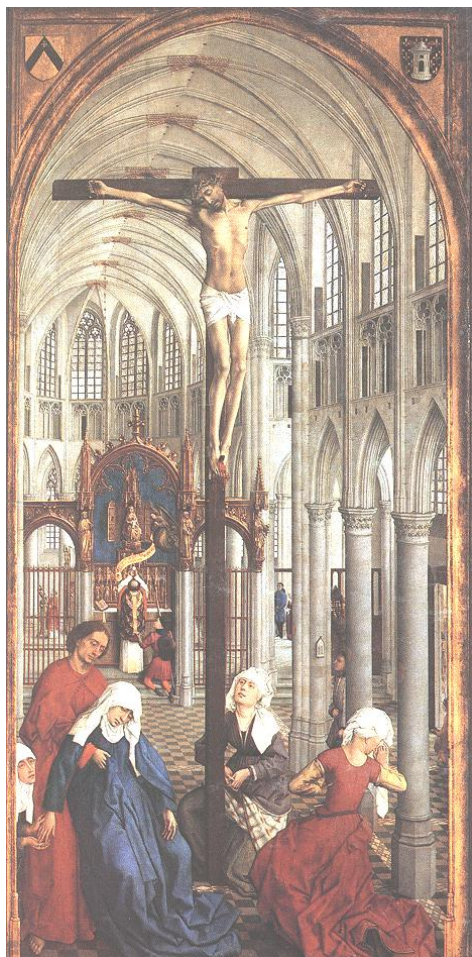

## OLD TESTAMENT READING

*Wisdom 4,7-15*

The just man, though he die early, shall be at rest. For the age that is honorable comes not with the passing of time, nor can it be measured in terms of years.

Rather, understanding is the hoary crown for men, and an unsullied life, the attainment of old age. He who pleased God was loved; he who lived among sinners was transported—Snatched away, lest wickedness pervert his mind or deceit beguile his soul; For the witchery of paltry things obscures what is right and the whirl of desire transforms the innocent mind. Having become perfect in a short while, he reached the fullness of a long career; for his soul was pleasing to the LORD, therefore he sped him out of the midst of wickedness. 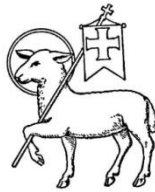



## *In Memoriam*



*Walt graduated from the University of California at Berkeley with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1955. As a member of ROTC, his first military assignment was Nuremburg, Germany. From there he returned to the States to teach in the ROTC program at California Polytechnic Institute in San Luis Obispo where he met Paula.*

*After assignments in Korea, Fort Lee, VA and Taiwan, Walt served one year in Vietnam. His tour of duty began in 1971. He received the Bronze Star Medal for his service.*

*His final assignments brought him to the Washington, DC area. Walt retired from the military in 1976.*

*He worked in the private sector until 2001. During this time, he earned an MBA, an MPA and a PhD.*
