



FROM THE SEMINARIAN...

Dear parishioners of St. John the Beloved,

Last week we celebrated a total of 4 Solemnities! Outside of the Easter octave, it's rare to have so many solemn celebrations contained all in one. One solemnity which stands out to me in particular this year is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. I have been reflecting on the witness they gave to Christ, even when it cost them their lives.

On the one hand, we have the apostle Paul, who seems fearless

in the face of every danger. He endured scourging, stoning, imprisonment, shipwreck, and yet remained earnest and fierce in spreading the gospel. Even at the end of his life, he never backed down, as seen in a speech he gave to some of his converts, "But now, compelled by the Spirit, I am going to Jerusalem. What will happen to me there I do not know, except that in one city after another the Holy Spirit has been warning me that imprisonment and hardships await me." (Acts 20:22-23) Paul went on to suffer many accusations by the Jews and imprisonment by the Romans, eventually spending his remaining years under house arrest in Rome before being beheaded during a persecution of the Christians. And yet in all the time before his death he continued to preach the gospel and to encourage his fellow believers. Paul stands out as a model for fearless Christian living that does not back down in the face of hardship.

In contrast to Paul we have the apostle Peter, the first pope and leader of the apostles in their many apostolic efforts, and yet from the gospels we know well that he is simple, foolish, and in a moment of crisis even denies Jesus, though he had sworn to remain with Him and die for Him. But Jesus comes to Peter and offers Him forgiveness and reconciliation after the resurrection; He assures Peter, too, that despite Peter's weakness he will one day fulfill his promise to die for Jesus, "…when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go.' He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God." (John 21:18b-19a) Peter is a model for us of how God is able to change our weakness into faithfulness.

So whether you feel like a Paul, fiercely devoted to God, or like a Peter, struggling to follow Our Lord, turn to God in confidence that He will give you the necessary strength. St. Peter and St. Paul, pray for us!
