The eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. In 1918 that formula heralded the end of the Great War, what we now call World War I. One year later President Woodrow Wilson observed the first Armistice Day, remarking that

a year ago today our enemies laid down their arms in accordance with an armistice which rendered them impotent to renew hostilities, and gave to the world an assured opportunity to reconstruct its shattered order and to work out in peace a new and more just set of international relations.

In 1926 the U.S. Congress called for the establishment of Armistice Day as a federal holiday, declaring that

...the 11th of November 1918, marked the cessation of the most destructive, sanguinary, and far reaching war in human annals and the resumption by the people of the United States of peaceful relations with other nations, which we hope may never again be severed...

In 1954 President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed into law a bill which changed Armistice Day into Veterans Day

calling on the people of the United States to observe two minutes of silence on Veterans Day in honor of the service and sacrifice of veterans throughout the history of the Nation, beginning at... 2:11 p.m. eastern standard time.

A century after the end of World War I, the list of current military conflicts goes well beyond Ukraine-Russia. Civil wars and internal conflicts are enveloping Ethiopia, Eritrea, Sudan, Yemen, Saudi Arabia, Syria, Mali, Somalia, Myanmar, and Mexico. Islamist insurgency afflicts Algeria, Burkina Faso, Chad, Libya, Mali, Niger, Tunisia, Togo, Benin, Ivory Coast, Mauritania, Ghana, Nigeria, Iraq, and Afghanistan. Meanwhile China inches closer to open hostilities on several fronts. The devil has his hands in every conflict.

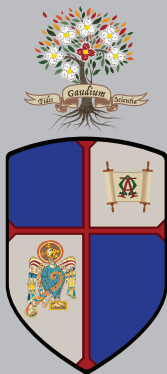

REQUIESANT IN PACEM

On November 2nd we commemorate all the faithful departed, and furthermore the entire month of November is dedicated to praying for the repose of the holy souls in Purgatory. Coming up are some traditions at our parish:

All Souls' Novena: please remember to submit well in advance the names of the departed you wish to be added to the novena. Their names will be placed on the altar from Nov 2nd through Nov 10th, and the sacrifice of the mass will be offered for their repose. If the sacristan has time and energy, she calligraphies the names onto index cards for the altar.

The Book of the Dead: on the last Saturday of October an empty binder will be placed at the feet of the statue of the Sacred Heart - He Who mercifully has a close connection to the souls in Purgatory. You are encouraged to write any names of the dead, and then during November folks can kneel and pray for the repose of their souls. This Book of the Dead will remain there for prayer until December 1st.

In December, the prayer intention papers from the book and novena will all be burned in the quarterly Holy Fire with myrrh incense and De Profundis (Psalm 129/130).

**BISHOP BURBIDGE ADDRESSES
PRESIDENT BIDEN'S ABORTION AGENDA**

President Biden recently stated that if the Democratic Party has control of Congress following the November 2022 election, his top priority will be pro-abortion legislation. I condemn abortion and any political tactic that would codify abortion as national policy. Fundamentally, abortion ends the life of a precious child and deeply wounds the child's mother. The role of Congress is to pass laws that serve the common good and yet this priority of the president only brings about pain and death.

We witness firsthand the wounds women and men endure after ending the life of their child. It is clear that they deserve better than abortion. Through various ministries, the Diocese of Arlington accompanies those who have suffered the pain of abortion.

Any attempt to codify abortion, rather than to enact policies that support unborn children and mothers, should be met with peaceful, active and staunch opposition from the Catholic faithful and all people of good will. While overturning Roe v. Wade was perhaps the most significant pro-life victory in the last century, there is much work to be done to make abortion unthinkable and support mothers in need. The Catholic Church has long offered hope, healing and material support to the vulnerable. We stand ready to continue serving all expectant families in need.
