

Hi, my name is Ray Goins, an Arlington seminarian starting my second year of formation at Mount St. Mary's this fall (or should I say, summer? We start early August). I am from Herndon, VA, the middle child of Ray and Sally Goins. I attended St. Joseph's Church



and School and graduated from Oakton High School in 2010. I obtained a Bachelor of Science degree at the United States Military Academy at West Point, commissioning as a Field Artillery officer in 2014. Then, I completed training at Fort Sill, Oklahoma prior to a year of service in Korea. Was blessed to return to Fort Sill to complete my commitment and was further blessed to participate in two discernment retreats sponsored by the Archdiocese for the Military Services (AMS). 
