These past weeks I have had several very good conversations with parishioners about why more people at Mass are not wearing masks.

I summarize the Governor's Executive Order as the Bishop has: as an "expectation" but not as a "requirement". There are so many exemptions to the state law that I wish to avoid interrogating those without a mask before they enter or after they are seated.

The alternatives are 1) overstating the case and saying that everyone must wear a mask when I know that a) the law provides for exceptions and b) parishioners will confront each other over the issue in church or 2) treating the Church as my private property and expelling those not wearing masks, which any homeowner or business owner has the right to do.

Everyone should know that Holy Communion is available after every Mass in the vestibule whether or not you listen to Mass outside via the speakers or watch online.

Anyone not wearing a mask in the pews should keep in mind that their not doing so has been keeping people at home.

Everywhere in the Commonwealth we are allowed to dine inside restaurants without wearing face coverings. By the end of July restaurants probably will not even have capacity limits, only spacing requirements.

Throughout Virginia the number of Covid hospitalizations continues to decline. Visit www.vdh.virginia.gov/coronavirus/ to see the raw data. In Northern Virginia the decline has been as steep since late April as the rise was before.

That should be encouraging.

Most heartening is that Jesus died for every single one of us.




We need more adorers to commit to spending one hour a week with Our Lord. If we had but 12 more people, every time slot would be full. Would you sign up to be one of those 12?

Escapism in a Pandemic: The Line between lie and truth

J.R.R. Tolkien (of Lord of the Rings lore) knew of good vs. bad leisure and provided ample material for the former. He gave a series of talks which became an essay, *On Fairy Stories*, his "definitive statement about his art — which he called



"Sub-creation" — and the concept that lies behind it – the power of words to create" or perhaps, discover "...a Secondary World" -tolkienestate.com/en/writing/ translations-essays/on-fairy-stories. Evil stories. meanwhile, he denounced and labeled "Enchantment" which enslave and mislead- i.e. most advertisements. Their story→ "you are unhappy and this *thing* will fix you..." Because we *are* made for happiness, they go on "...you *need* this *thing*..." And because we *are* made and pining for eternal bliss, they drag on "...but wait, there's more!" If you're questioning your leisure(s), recall that Tolkein provides material for a good kind; but, infinitely more so- God, who loves us enough to remind us that the cross is daily and necessary. The lie of ads: "eat, drink, and be merry." The Christ's fiery reply: "I want all of that for you and more- but please wait! Listen to my Mom, Our Lady at Fatima, who knows "our time-with special insight... Mary Most Holy's insistent invitation to penance is...the manifestation of her maternal concern for the fate of the human family, in need of conversion and forgiveness" -St. John Paul II's message for the 1997 World Day of the Sick. What does the cross or penance look like in my life?


