



Please consider attending the Fairfax County School Board meeting where they will vote on proposed changes to the Family Life Education curriculum. Among the recommendations presented are the following:

• "Sex assigned at birth" should be the language used to teach children that biology has no impact on being male or female,

• "Clergy" are to be removed from a list of trusted adults children should talk with about concerns they have regarding sex and sexuality,

• Students will be taught about pre-exposure prophylaxis (also called PrEP) which is a drug regimen designed for use by those who are engaged in sexual behaviors that cannot be mentioned here, and

• That abstinence will no longer be taught as the only 100% effective method of preventing sexually transmitted infections or diseases.

FROM THE SEMINARIAN...

My name is Charles, and I'm a Seminarian at Mt. St. Mary's, in Emmitsburg, Md where I have completed one year of studies. I have been granted the distinct privilege of being assigned to St. John the Beloved for the summer and I am very grateful to Fr. Pollard and Fr. Sina for their warm welcome and I look forward to many weeks of exciting projects and experi-



ences ahead. I have much to learn and, as a proverbial sponge, intend to absorb as much as is humanly possible. In this weekly column, as I grow in the faith, I look forward to sharing with you what I am learning and reflecting on my faith journey.

I was born in the US and moved to the UK when I was five years old. I lived in England until aged 26 when I returned to the US to join the Navy. I was on active duty for 14 years as a Hospital Corpsman and spent half of my career attached to the Marines. I've been stationed in Japan and Korea, deployed to Iraq as a platoon Corpsman with the Marine Corps infantry; as well as Afghanistan; Djibouti, and a deployment aboard the USS Iwo Jima. Suffice to say the Lord has blessed me with many, incredible experiences both good and bad, joyful, and even sad.

God doesn't call the qualified but qualifies those He calls. This has become more and more apparent to me as I reflect on my years in the Navy. On many, many occasions, the Lord protected me from harm, and this seems to me to have all been part of God's plan for me, and preparation for the next stage of my life as a Catholic Christian. As a co-sponsored Seminarian, with the Archdiocese for the Military Services picking-up half the cost of Seminary, I will be returning, God willing, to the Navy as a Chaplain at some point after I am ordained; to serve God's people, and to give back to our country. Our country has given so much to me, the least I can do for her is to one day return to active duty, and to once more serve those who defend our Nation's values and freedoms and to offer it all up to our Lord.

God tells us in Isaiah 41: 10, "Fear not, for I am with you." This verse has been on my mind and in my heart over the years, especially while deployed. God is with us every step of the way and all we need to do is reach out, and He will guide us. God has done amazing things for me. He brought me through many deployments unscathed, and I know now it was for a specific reason. So, Ladies and Gentlemen, this was a brief introduction from yours truly. I look forward to meeting you all, and to sharing more of my thoughts and experiences with you over the coming weeks. Please pray for me, and I will pray for you.




