My sixth grade religion class at St. John the Beloved Academy has memorized the names of all the books of the Old Testament. Along the way we have encountered the seven books that were dropped by some Christians in the 1500s on account of ignoring the testimony of the Septuagint and the authority of the Church. Among those seven books is the Book of Sirach, which is a real gem. I encourage you to read it. Here is the beginning of chapter 6:

- 2 Do not exalt yourself through your soul's counsel, lest your soul be torn in pieces like a bull.
- 3 You will devour your leaves and destroy your fruit, and will be left like a withered tree.
- 4 An evil soul will destroy him who has it, and make him the laughingstock of his enemies.
- 5 A pleasant voice multiplies friends, and a gracious tongue multiplies courtesies.
- 6 Let those that are at peace with you be many, but let your advisers be one in a thousand.
- 7 When you gain a friend, gain him through testing, and do not trust him hastily.
- 8 For there is a friend who is such at his own convenience, but will not stand by you in your day of trouble.
- 9 And there is a friend who changes into an enemy, and will disclose a quarrel to your disgrace.
- 10 And there is a friend who is a table companion, but will not stand by you in your day of trouble.
- 11 In your prosperity he will make himself your equal, and be bold with your servants;
- 12 but if you are brought low he will turn against you, and will hide himself from your presence.
- 13 Keep yourself far from your enemies, and be on guard toward your friends.
- 14 A faithful friend is a sturdy shelter: he that has found one has found a treasure.
- 15 There is nothing so precious as a faithful friend, and no scales can measure his excellence.
- 16 A faithful friend is an elixir of life; and those who fear the Lord will find him.
- 17 Whoever fears the Lord directs his friendship aright, for as he is, so is his neighbor also.

Basilica of Saint Mary—The Science and Significance of Eucharistic Miracles

On October 25, 2022, at 7 p.m. in the Basilica of Saint Mary's Lyceum Auditorium, 313 Duke Street, Alexandria, there will be a multimedia presentation by Steve Hemler and Lee Granger of the Catholic Apologetics Institute of North America (CAINA), which will highlight the importance of the Holy Eucharist and provides an overview of the amazing findings of scientific studies of several Eucharistic miracles. The consistent teaching of the Catholic Church is that the Eucharist is truly the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ under the appearance of bread and wine. But most people, even many Catholics, doubt this teaching. In order to manifest Christ's Real Presence and dispel doubts, God sometimes provides us with Eucharistic miracles, which include consecrated hosts being transformed into real human flesh and blood. This presentation will strengthen faith in the Real Presence and equip attendees with new information for sharing with family and friends about the importance of regularly attending Mass.

CATHOLIC PARISHES UNDER ATTACK IN BURKINA FASO.

A second coup this year on September 30th has left Burkina Faso (West Africa) in chaos, abetting Islamic militants in persecuting Catholics, who comprise 17% of the population. Over 60% of the country is said to be under control of jihadist groups. About 10% of the population has been displaced and this year alone 5,000 schools have been ransacked and burned down. Many of them were Catholic.

Fr. Alphonse Kabore, who ministered at St. John the Beloved for several recent summers, has issued an urgent appeal for support for his parish in the town of Pouytenga and for its rural missions, which are especially vulnerable. The jihadist threat is closing in, making outings to offer Mass, administer sacraments or assist parishioners in other missions risky. Yes, many prayers are needed. But also financial help to reinforce the schools and keep the children as safe: build security walls with barbed wire around the church, rectory, missions, and many schools, secure gates and emergency exits, fixing old and destroyed buildings, ceilings, windows, doors because the climate is humid and malaria is causing a lot of sickness as well.

Yes, many prayers are needed.
