With this recent observance of Thanksgiving, have you noticed something eerily different after weekday Mass? Have you heard the silence?

If not, it might be because weekday Mass is not part of your routine. I remember when my parents started going to Mass on Saturday morning in addition to Sunday morning. The quiet devotion of the smaller gathering seemed so much more intimate and prayerful than Sunday Mass. It also seemed like I was all of a sudden part of a hidden world. Now I might describe it as a gateway drug. Anyway, daily Mass is beautifully simple.

Another hidden part of the life of the church are the prayers of the sacristy. Making a personal act of thanksgiving after Mass is integral to the Sacred Liturgy. In fact, *Canon Law* requires priests to do so. In the five minutes of silence you now enjoy after Mass please join us in this (composed by Fr. Scalia and recited by all St. John servers after Mass) and other prayers of thanksgiving:

Mary, holy virgin mother, I have received your Son, Jesus Christ. With love you became His mother, gave birth to Him, nursed Him and helped Him grow to manhood.

With love I return Him to you, to hold once more, to love with all your heart and to offer to the Holy Trinity as our supreme act of worship, for your honor and for the good of all your pilgrim brothers and sisters.

Mother, ask God to forgive my sins and to help me serve Him more faithfully. Keep me true to Christ until death and let me come to praise Him with you for ever and ever. Amen.

More Pro-Life Good News: Assisted Suicide Rejected!!!

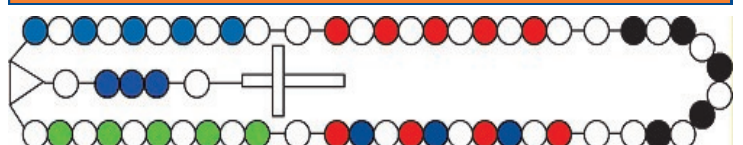
Your comments were heard loud and clear!

The Virginia Joint Commission on Health Care took decisive action on the recent assisted suicide study, on which the Virginia Catholic Conference and so many of you submitted comments. By a vote of 10-6, the commission voted for the option we recommended: to take no action on the study.

The commission received nearly 3,000 public comments against legalizing assisted suicide ... many of them yours. In fact, comments against assisted suicide outnumbered comments for assisted suicide 8-1!

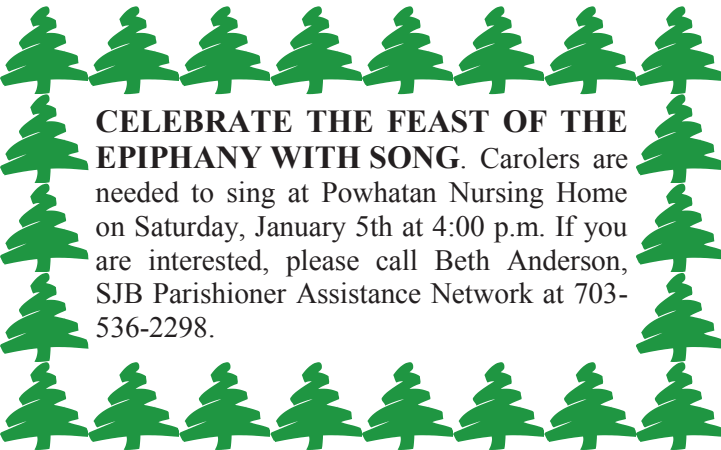

CHARITABLE GIVING OPPORTUNITY

This Christmas season offers a special giving opportunity for anyone 70½ years or older to make a Charitable gift to Saint John the Beloved Parish or St. John Academy from their Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Until the end of the year, a gift of up to \$100,000 will be excluded from your taxable income. This allows you to make distributions directly to one or more charities from your traditional or Roth IRA, as long as you are at least 70 ½ years old when you transfer the gifts. Such gifts can be made without increasing your taxable income or withholding. Additionally, funds transferred from your IRA to a charity will NOT subject your Social Security income to higher tax levels, and will count toward your minimum required distribution. This information is not intended to be legal or tax advice. If you are interested in donating a gift to us in this way, we urge you to seek the advice of a competent professional. What better time than at Christmas to share in the joy that Saint John the Beloved Parish and St. John Academy share with all those around them, the love of Jesus Christ.
