FROM THE SEMINARIAN...

St. Ignatius' second stage is called "the maturing Christian." The "maturing Christian" is growing, intensely purifying their soul, and rising from good to better in the service of God. As they grow, Satan will bite, torment, and discourage them, reminding them of what they left behind, to



bring them back to their previous life of sin. The Holy Spirit, on the other hand, provides constant encouragement, praising, and willing them on in the pursuit of holiness. If you identify as a maturing Christian, know that Satan desires your soul, and is willing to do everything in his power to derail your efforts to become holy.

Per St. Ignatius, Satan will use a number of ways to thwart your efforts at becoming holy and to win you back. As the master of lies and deceit, he will tell you that you will ultimately fail, so why even bother, or how could God love a person such as you? Self-doubt, cynicism and negativity comes from Satan, so when you feel this recite the St. Michael prayer and ask Mary for strength. Becoming holy is challenging, but to go to Heaven we must persevere to the end; after all, as our Lord said, we must strive to enter through the narrow gate, (Lk 13:24) and as our Lord also said, many are called, but few are chosen. (Mt 22: 14).

We make mistakes and God understands this; however, our salvation depends on how much effort we put into becoming holier people. Never stop seeking holiness and when you sin, go back to Confession, and ask the Lord to help you again. Growing in holiness means recognizing what led you to sin initially, so you can protect yourself by avoiding making similar mistakes. Furthermore, confess the small sins (venial), not just the big ones (mortal). St. Augustine said that unconfessed venial sins can lead to mortal sins, and if you die with unconfessed mortal sins on your soul, you go to Hell. There is no limit to God's love and mercy, so go to Confession a lot and avail yourselves of the sacraments to grow in holiness. Growing in holiness is achievable, but we must desire it, and ask for it.

We are in the fight of our lives, for Satan is no longer hiding in the shadows, but out in public, proudly proclaiming that sin is good. As adopted sons and daughters of Christ, we are thorns in the side of Satan as we bear witness to a culture that rejects Christ and celebrates that which is intrinsically disordered and evil. As Christians we must bear witness to the light of truth and bring those souls back to the Lord, and as maturing Christians, cognizant of the dangers to ourselves and to others, we must ensure we never take our eyes off Christ, committed to serving Him with all our heart, all our mind and with all our strength.


