








Susan Muskett graduated from Georgetown University and received her law degree from the University of Notre Dame Law School. Susan spent most of her career lobbying on the pro-life issues before the U.S. Congress, including for the National Right to Life Committee where she served as Senior Legislative Counsel. She now serves as President of Pro-Family Women. In July, Susan's article on parental rights was published in the *Arlington Catholic Herald*. Last March, Susan was a participant in a webinar, "The Equality Act and What It Means for Catholics," that was put on by multiple dioceses across the country, including the Arlington Diocese, as well as the Virginia Catholic Conference.
