IN TESTIMONIUM...

The issue of immigration finds Catholics and independent thinkers caught in a quagmire with traditional political forces framing the argument in which one side seems to want open borders and other desires a steady stream of cheap labor. Perhaps I am wrong in that observation but the teaching of the Church is clear enough to delineate boundaries for reasonable discussion.

With the same balance that we read in Chapter 13 of St. Paul's Letter to the Romans wherein the Apostle admonishes the Church in capital of the empire to obey the government, obey the commandments and love their neighbor, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches

CCC 2241 The more prosperous nations are obliged, to the extent they are able, to welcome the foreigner in search of the security and the means of livelihood which he cannot find in his country of origin. Public authorities should see to it that the natural right is respected that places a guest under the protection of those who receive him.

Political authorities, for the sake of the common good for which they are responsible, may make the exercise of the right to immigrate subject to various juridical conditions, especially with regard to the immigrants' duties toward their country of adoption. Immigrants are obliged to respect with gratitude the material and spiritual heritage of the country that receives them, to obey its laws and to assist in carrying civic burdens.


Beyond this teaching, we have questions and opinions.

Have you had to deal with trespassers on your property? How did you handle it? Have you found a way to tell people charitably that they are not welcome? How do treat people when they come to your door begging for money? Do you find a way to help them even if you are not going to give them what they want? Have you had to intervene when someone enters your home with bad intent? Have you had to care for a child who was kidnapped from mom and dad? As a priest I have faced all these situations. None of them are easy.

How should the government act when foreigners want to contribute to our society? when refugees seek shelter? when the downtrodden want jobs and government services? when criminals want to take advantage of our benevolence? when parents commit crimes in the company of their children? None of these are easy questions, especially when political and business interests cloud good judgment.


SACRED MUSIC APPRENTICESHIP

FROM THE SEMINARIAN...

June 22-29 marked this year's Religious Freedom week and as our Holy Father has rightfully pointed out, religious freedom is America's most precious possession. We are, in fact, the only nation in the World where religious freedom played such an important part, even a vital part, in its founding. Have no doubt, the United States is a



Christian nation; after all, to whom do we owe our inalienable rights as Americans? However, this freedom is increasingly under attack in the name of 'tolerance' with Christian businesses or Catholic Orphanages directly affected. The order is worship the Golden Calf, or else!

President Reagan once said that freedom (sic, in general) is never more than one generation away from extinction. This goes for religious freedom as well. We must not acquiesce to a culture which teaches a false Gospel and wishes to silence us unless we embrace the new tolerance. Jesus was never tolerant (ask the money changers), so neither should we be. As the culture continues to attack religious freedom, it is up to us to resist this evil, not only through the courts, but through the way we live. After all, when we die we won't be judged on how 'tolerant' we were, but on how faithful we were to our Lord.

Catholic schools, orphanages and businesses are all under assault by the radical Left, and Archbishop Chaput has urged us to fight vigorously this assault on our religious freedom in the voting booth, the courts, and in the public square. And while SCOTUS may occasionally rule in our favor, their decisions won't change the dark and Godless society which assaults our family values on a daily basis. Our families are threatened by what Cardinal Sara refers to as a demonic gender ideology. These ideologues brand us bigots for holding to the teachings of Jesus Christ, and therefore, beyond the ability of SCOTUS to change. And while we welcome their rulings, a heart filled with hatred of God is outside of their jurisdiction. Friends, not only are we in a battle for religious freedom, but also for the soul of our nation.

The Liberals have won the culture war, albeit for now, so we must remain resilient. The 2016 election was a much-needed victory for our cause (divinely ordained?), for God is on our side. How many of us really think about the significance of religious freedom? As we meditate on this question, let us ask the Lord for the grace to overcome the culture of death, to be beacons of hope for our beleaguered country, with a renewed zeal to spread the Gospel. Our single greatest weapon in this fight is the rosary which ensured victory at Lepanto, and it can bring in this battle too. St. Thomas More, pray for us.


BOOK DISCUSSION (7/11)
