Born Anjezë Gonxhe Bojaxhiu on 26 August 1910 in what was Üsküp, Kosovo Vilayet, Ottoman Empire and is now Skopje, Republic of North Macedonia.

> Died on 5 September 1997 in Calcutta, West Bengal, India.

Beatified on 19 October 2003 in Saint Peter's Square, Vatican City by Pope John Paul II.

Canonized on 4 September 2016 in Saint Peter's Square, Vatican City by Pope Francis.

Due to the great generosity of some parishioners and the extraordinary benevolence of the Apostolic Nuncio to Albania, The Most Rev. Charles Brown, a first-class relic of St. Teresa of Calcutta and a worthy reliquary have been procured and will be installed in the Church of St. John the Beloved.

Her mission to the poorest of the poor was one the greatest examples of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy going hand in hand. The Missionaries of Charity continue her charism to be so prayerful, so penitential, so charitable, so joyful (so authentically Christian) that those whom they serve will be drawn to the mercy of God and the sacramental life that flows from the Cross of Calvary. Holiness is inescapably apostolic.

2020–21 REGISTRATION

Out of concern and in compliance with the restrictions and regulations surrounding COVID19, Religious Education at St. John the Beloved will be delivered in two main parts this year.

PART I:

Students in grades 1 and 3-8 will be enrolled in the "Faith and Life" online program through MYCATHOLICFAITHDELIVERED and will be expected to complete the year by June 30, 2021. (If you would like a textbook in addition to the online program, please email the RE Office at mmills@stjohncatholicmclean.org.) Students in grade 2 will be enrolled in the "Spirit of Truth" digital edition (which includes a textbook) in preparation for reception of First Penance and First Holy Communion. A catechist will be assigned to each grade to track assignments, communicate with students/parents, and assist remotely as needed.

PART II:

"Evenings of Catechesis and Prayer" will be offered by our priests in the church for all students and their families (grades 1–8) each Tuesday and Thursday from 7PM-8PM. These are not mandatory, but we do hope you will come when you are both comfortable and able.

Additional Sacramental preparation and required Safe Environment Training will be offered through distance learning and in seminars throughout the year. Those dates and times are forthcoming.


ADORATION
