Did you know that the World Health Organization in 2005 declared the combined hormonal contraceptive to be a group 1 carcinogen and "a known and probably cancercausing agent to humans"? But that is not why it is wrong but it should make you want to learn more.

This coming Wednesday is the fiftieth anniversary of Humanae Vitae, the encyclical letter published by Pope Paul VI. Please read the original document and, just as importantly, read those who can help you understand it.

Until my second year of the seminary when I heard the lecture "Contraception, Why Not?" by the professor Janet Smith, I acknowledged this teaching of the Church but did not understand its necessity. God bless the benefactor who sent an audio tape for each of the seminarians.

Professor Smith has updated her talk over the decades. Kimberly Hahn provides another powerful witness. Her father was a Protestant minister and her husband is Dr. Scott Hahn. Grappling with the Church's teachings on family life and artificial contraception eventually led her to conclude that the Roman Catholic Church is the Church founded by Christ. Over the course of the next year we plan to have a monthly lecture series on Humanae Vitae that will bring to St. John some of the other great with powerful voices on this critical topic.

FROM THE SEMINARIAN...

Ignatian spirituality provides us with a very powerful means of developing a better relationship with God. Our journey towards holiness requires us to listen constantly to God, attentive to His will for us and it is only by following His will that we can become the best person God wants us to be, the best version of



ourselves. Where are we in terms of our relationship with God? St. Ignatius of Loyola wrote about twelve stages or steps to holiness which I will expound upon over the next few weeks. They serve as indicators of where we are, what challenges await us, and what we can anticipate.

The big message that I wish to convey this week is have hope and persevere. Creating an openness to God, facilitating an open line of communication unencumbered by sin, is our objective, so as to permit Him to guide our lives. However, arriving at this goal has many challenges which St. Ignatius identifies for us and which can prevent us from hearing God's voice. Stage one, called 'the regressing Christian,' is someone who is stuck in a cycle of perpetual sin. The person who is content to live like this feels no regret; however, the Christian seeking holiness feels pain and remorse. This remorse serves as a catalyst to change.

An attachment to sin prevents us hearing God's voice and allowing God to help us grow in grace. We suffer from concupiscence which makes sin attractive to us, but fortunately for us God understands our situation hence He gave us the Church and the Sacraments to help us. If you identify as a regressing Christian do not despair, have hope and continue to persevere, for each time we fall, we must pull ourselves back-up by our bootstraps, a task made easier with God's grace. Go to confession and keep praying. It is vitally important that you attend Mass even if you are unable to receive the Eucharist. Place yourself in the presence of our Lord to receive strength. Have hope and do not succumb to despair for that comes from Satan who seeks to keep you down and away from God's grace.

We must never lose our faith and trust in God, for with His help we will prevail. Nothing is impossible with God, therefore give Him everything. Our attachment to sin is a major obstacle to hearing God's voice in prayer, yet He knows our struggles. Despite our failures and the hurt we constantly cause Him, God loves us all the same, more than we could ever possibly imagine. So, we ask our Blessed Mother for her help and intercession in overcoming whatever sins we are struggling with, to remove any obstacles that may be preventing us from hearing God's voice and allowing Him to really work in our lives, to make us instruments of His mercy.




