Feast Day of St. Peter Claver

St. Peter Claver, SJ, was a member of the Society of Jesus and is the patron of African missions and of interracial justice, due to his work with slaves in Colombia.

Peter Claver was born to a prosperous family in Verdu, Spain, and earned his first degree in Barcelona. He entered the Jesuits in 1601. When he was in Majorca studying philosophy, Claver was encouraged by Alphonsus Rodriguez, the saintly doorkeeper of the college, to go to the missions in America. Claver listened, and in 1610 he landed in Cartagena, Colombia. After completing his studies in Bogotá, Peter was ordained in Cartagena in 1616.

Cartagena was one of two ports where slaves from Africa arrived to be sold in South America. Between the years 1616 and 1650, Peter Claver worked daily to minister to the needs of the 10,000 slaves who arrived each year.

When a ship arrived, Peter first begged for fruits, biscuits, or sweets to bring to the slaves. He then went on board with translators to bring his gifts as well as his skills as a doctor and teacher. Claver entered the holds of the ships and would not leave until every person received a measure of care. Peter gave short instruction in the Catholic faith and baptized as many as he could. In this way he could prevail on the slave owners to give humane treatment to fellow Christians. Peter Claver baptized more than 300,000 slaves by 1651, when he was sickened by the plague.

In the last years of his life Peter was too ill to leave his room. The ex-slave who was hired to care for him treated him cruelly, not feeding him many days, and never bathing him. Claver never complained. He was convinced that he deserved this treatment.

In 1654 Peter was anointed with the oil of the Sacrament of the Sick. When Cartagenians heard the news, they crowded into his room to see him for the last time. They treated Peter Claver's room as a shrine, and stripped it of everything but his bedclothes for mementos. Claver died September 7, 1654.

St. Peter Claver and St. Alphonsus Rodriguez were canonized along with St. John Berchmans S.J. and the Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order on January 15, 1888.

A young parishioner born in 1997 is in need of a kidney donor. If you are open to becoming a kidney donor, please visit the website for the MedStar Georgetown Transplant Institute: <https://mgti.donorscreen.org/register/donate-kidney>. The young man's name and date of birth, which will be needed for registration, can be provided by Fr. Pollard (fr.pollard@stjohncatholicmclean.org). Donors can be reimbursed for lost wages and other expenses. Since the recipient is 23 years old the preferred donor age is between 21 and 49. However, doctors are allowing older candidates to be tested since the finding of such a qualifying living donor could make available the needed transplant through the Paired Kidney Exchange.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the past several months we have seen a great deal of unrest in communities throughout our nation. While many people have protested peacefully against injustice, others unfortunately have turned to violence, rioting, and even looting. Most Americans of course simply desire peace in their communities.

Although legal and legislative efforts are essential in establishing the justice that brings peace, we also recognize that they are not enough. In such circumstances, Our Lord recommends to us, his disciples, the ancient practices of prayer and fasting (cf. Mk 9:29).

As such, I and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops invite you to join in observing *Wednesday, September 9, 2020 as a day of prayer and fasting for peace in our communities*. That day is the Memorial of Saint Peter Claver, whose ministry to the African slaves brought to the new world serves as a great example of how to bring the peace of Christ to others.

2020-21 REGISTRATION

Out of concern and in compliance with the restrictions and regulations surrounding COVID19, Religious Education at St. John the Beloved will be delivered in two main parts this year.

PART I:

Students in grades 1 and 3-8 will be enrolled in the "Faith and Life" online program through MYCATHOLICFAITHDELIVERED and will be expected to complete the year by June 30, 2021. (If you would like a textbook in addition to the online program, please email the RE Office at mmills@stjohncatholicmclean.org.) Students in grade 2 will be enrolled in the "Spirit of Truth" digital edition (which includes a textbook) in preparation for reception of First Penance and First Holy Communion. A catechist will be assigned to each grade to track assignments, communicate with students/parents, and assist remotely as needed.

PART II:

"Evenings of Catechesis and Prayer" will be offered by our priests in the church for all students and their families (grades 1-8) each Tuesday and Thursday from 7PM-8PM. These are not mandatory, but we do hope you will come when you are both comfortable and able.

Additional Sacramental preparation and required Safe Environment Training will be offered through distance learning and in seminars throughout the year. Those dates and times are forthcoming.

REGISTRATION FEE for the 2020/2021 RE Year will be \$75.00 per student and can be paid online or by check to the Parish Office, attention Religious Ed.

A RE calendar will be distributed by the beginning of September.

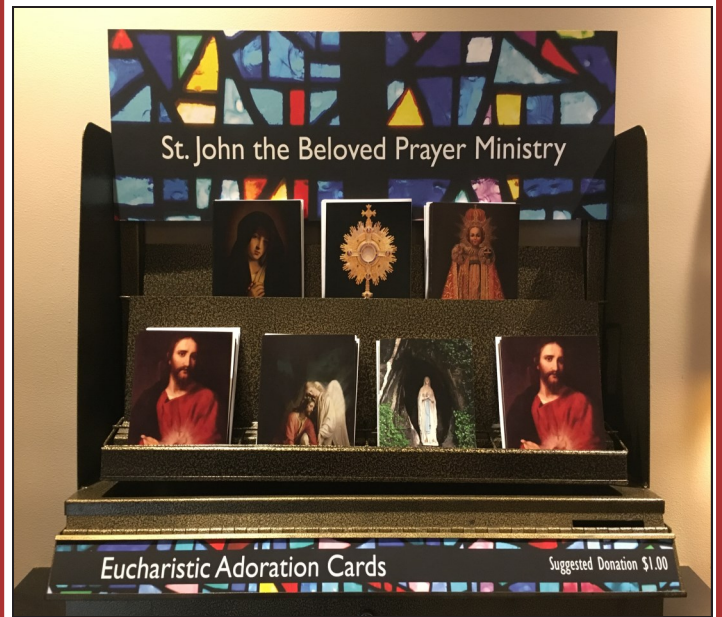
ADORATION
