IMMEDIATE NEED: LEADER FOR DECORATING CREW

The Deck Crew is currently made up of skilled and experienced adults and older kids who know their way around the decorative items and customs of the parish. They handle the non-liturgical preparations such as Christmas decorations, Easter decorations, Passiontide veiling, Holy Thursday altar of repose, and Corpus Christi altar of benediction. Some of these activities require a sharp eye for details, others require height, strength, and health, so the crew has a mixed demographic who collaborate well.

The Deck Crew is in immediate need of a 'crew chief' who is able to plan, schedule, organize, communicate, coordinate, and be lovingly responsible that it all gets done. Given that the members do a great job already, the leader doesn't need to have any artistic talent, but rather a good sense of commitment to the house of the Lord, in tune with the liturgical seasons. This commitment includes being onsite for a few hours on both Dec 23rd and Dec 24th to prepare for Christmas Day.

Similar to how our fantastic Flower Guild operates, the leader would coordinate with the sacristan and clergy that things are done at appropriate liturgical timing, and respectful of liturgical needs and holy spaces. If the leader is interested, he or she could also help with other small decorative touches throughout the year that do not require a crew.

If interested, please contact the sacristan via the front office. She can give you a schedule of when stuff's been customarily done so far, as well as an inventory orientation the Christmas gear in particular is vast! The next seasonal shift will be the un-decorating on Saturday, June 3rd (last day of Pentecost week, eve of Trinity Sunday) so a leader needs to be determined well before then.
