

At Catholic Charities' Family Services, clinicians provide counseling to individuals, couples, and families. Clients often seek services for issues such as anxiety, depression, grief/loss, addictions, marital and premarital concerns, and more.

If you are interested in receiving services, please call 703-425-0109. When you call, the intake coordinator will gather your information and ask you to briefly describe your situation. You and the staff person will assess the appropriateness of our services to your need. When the clinician has an opening, the intake coordinator or the clinician will call to schedule an appointment.

Christine is a licensed clinical social worker (LCSW) and has been on staff with Catholic Charities, Family Services since 2010. Christine obtained her Master of Social Work degree from The Catholic University of America in Washington, DC. She provides counseling services for adults, adolescents, and families on a range of issues including depression, anxiety, grief and loss, relationship problems, trauma and abuse, addictions, and life transitions. She is currently working towards certification in Eve Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR), an evidence-based trauma treatment that alleviates distress associated with disturbing memories. Christine has an understanding of multicultural issues and values the integration of faith and spirituality in counseling.

Christine will be available for appointments on Tuesdays at St. John the Beloved beginning in January 2019. She accepts most major insurance plans including those with Blue Cross Blue Shield, Aetna, and Cigna, and she also accepts clients on a sliding scale based on income.
