



Our Lord never promised an easy road for those who choose to follow Him and every day we must guard ourselves against sin and reject our culture's celebration of all that is evil. Consider the Rosary, which is a very powerful tool to help us get to Heaven, our Blessed Mother made 15 promises to those who prayed it every day found at this link.

Prayer is transformative, but there are also other methods available to us, to make us holy people and worthy of heaven.

This will dramatically improve your prayer life and from then on you will receive many graces. St. Teresa of Avila said that anything she asked of St. Joseph, he granted her, so I ask him every day to increase my faith and to help me become a better Catholic. Once you have made prayer an essential part of your life you'll experience a renewed joy and zeal for the Lord, and grace to persevere in holiness.

Our fallen nature makes sin very attractive to us and it's only through prayer and the sacraments that we remain in Christ, resist sin and witness to Christ in this fallen world. Hell is a truth we ignore at our peril and meditating on it is important for our salvation as it keeps our focus on Jesus. We need to stay close to Jesus and consecrating ourselves, as mentioned earlier, is one way we can do this. We can also help each other by correcting sinful behavior, always mindful of doing it with compassion and kindness (James 5: 19-20), for what we fail to correct in others when we had the chance, we will answer for.


SJB SOCCER CLUB


