On the eve of the completion of a great work of God, the Church turns to the prayer called Te Deum, a litany of praise attributed to Saint Ambrose and Saint Augustine. We sing it at the end of the Office of Readings as every Sunday and Solemnity begins. With great ceremony is this done publicly in Rome during Vespers on New Year's Eve. So too is it fitting for us just before Fr. Sina completes his service at St. John.

O GOD, we praise Thee: we acknowledge Thee to be the Lord. Everlasting Father, all the earth doth worship Thee. To Thee all the Angels, the Heavens and all the Powers, all the Cherubim and Seraphim, unceasingly proclaim: Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts! Heaven and earth are full of the Majestv of Thy glory. The glorious choir of the Apostles, the wonderful company of Prophets, the white-robed army of Martyrs praise Thee. 
