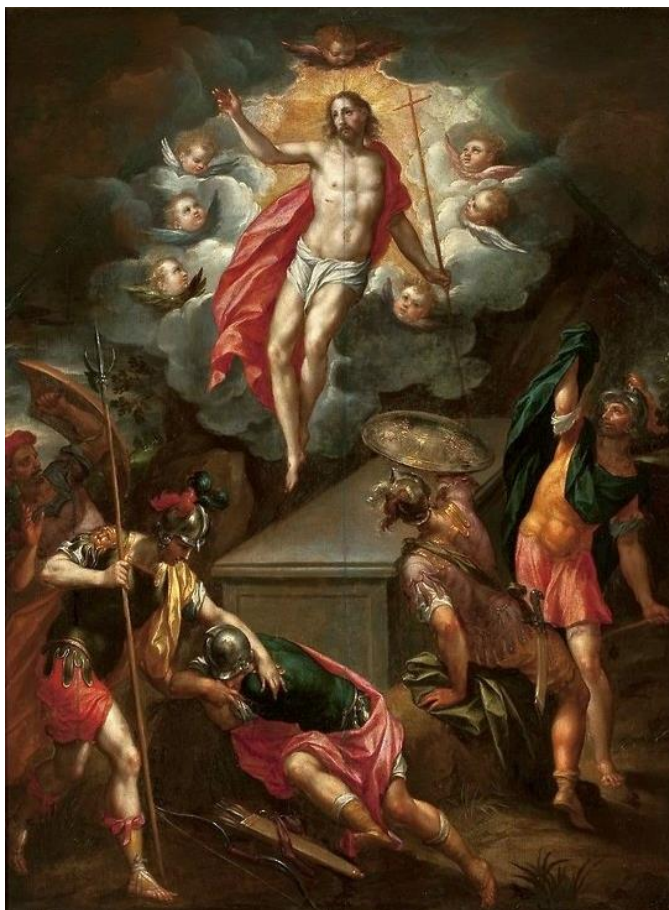


Not faithless, but believing be." Alleluia!

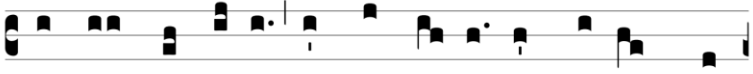
How blest are they who have not seen,

In laud and jubilee and praise. Alleluia!

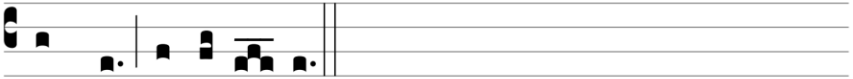

Victorious King, hear our prayer.


You have triumphed over death, your enemy; destroy in us the power of death,
