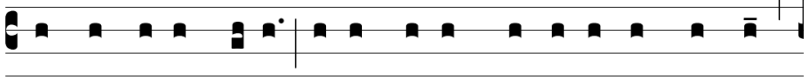

And sweet anointing from above.

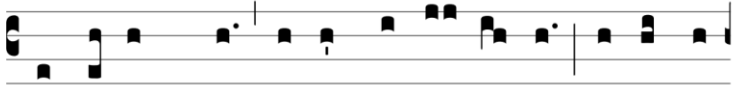
