

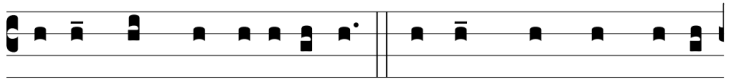

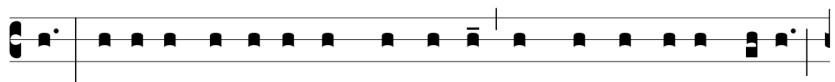

So shall I never, never part from thee.

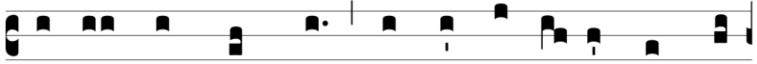

Lord, may your kingdom come.


Grant peace to the world,
